## **ERIE CANAL and NIAGARA FALLS**

#### Tour Leader – Joanne Kessler – July 16-19, 2024

This is quite a unique trip as you escape the hot Maryland sun and head north, to begin our adventures in Brockport, New York. This charming historic town will be yours to explore as the hotel is steps from the town. Dinner is included.

After breakfast at your hotel the next morning, we will travel to the **Strong Museum of Play** which is one of the largest history museums in the country and home to the **National Toy Hall of Fame** as well as the **World Video Game Hall of Fame**. Remember pinball machines? Nerf Balls? Easy Bake Ovens? Become a child again and enjoy all these toys from your childhood! We then continue to Fairport NY and enjoy a three-hour lunch cruise on the *Colonial Bell*, along the Erie Canal with lock passage while enjoying a historically narrated cruise. After the cruise you will enjoy a wine



tasting at **Casa Larga Winery** which has been producing superior award-winning wines and creating a unique experience for all their guests since 1974. Dinner will be on your own in Rochester.

On our third travel day, after breakfast we will go to Lockport and enjoy a two-hour cruise on another portion of the Erie Canal which is a 19<sup>th</sup> century marvel of engineering. Since its opening in 1825, the Erie Canal has been enlarged three time to accommodate larger boats and more traffic. Changes were made to the route and to canal structures like docks and bridges each time. Do you know you can still travel by boat from Albany to Buffalo and beyond! The canal includes 524 continuous miles of navigable waterways. It was designated as the Erie Canalway National Heritage Corridor in 2000.

We will have a white linen buffet lunch at the pier following the canal ride.



After lunch we continue to **Niagara Falls** where we will meet a local guide for a tour which includes the **Rainbow Bridge** and the **Floral Clock**. A thrilling ride awaits aboard the famous *Maid of the Mist* where we will hear the crashing water, see the breathtaking views, and soak up every drop of powerful spray from the impressive falls. We then go up the Observation Tower which extends dramatically over Niagara Gorge and offers unobstructed views of the falls as well as the raging

whitewater below. The Observation Tower provides

the only panoramic view of all three falls, including the American Falls. Then we are off to the **Herschell Carrousel Factory Museum** where over 3,000 hand-carved wooden carousels were built in the early 1900s. Ride the carousels, listen to the Wurlitzers and enjoy some personal memories. Dinner is included at the Hard Rock Café by the falls. After dinner take a short walk to the falls for a spectacular evening illumination and enjoy the beautiful light display.



We will enjoy breakfast at the hotel before leaving for Damascus. There will be a lunch stop and rest stops on our way home with wonderful memories. We will arrive in Damascus at 8:30 PM.


